The Advanced International Certificate of Education (AICE) — Cambridge Program offers a rigorous, advanced, academic curriculum that emphasizes analysis, problem solving, and communication skills to thrive globally. Students who earn the Cambridge AICE Diploma can be awarded college credit or advanced standing at the university level, in addition to receiving the Florida Bright Futures Academic Scholars Award (covering 100% tuition and fees at a Florida public postsecondary institution.

iTech Academy is a Magnet Schools of America National Award of Excellence program that offers a sequence of courses that provides coherent and rigorous content aligned with challenging academic standards and relevant technical knowledge and skills needed to prepare for further education and careers such as Game/Simulation Designer, Game Programmer, and Game Software Developer. Students can acquire several industry credentials in the Information Technology cluster.

The Academy of Hospitality and Tourism was established in 1987 in partnership with the American Express Philanthropic Foundation. Miami Springs Senior High was the first school in Miami Dade County to offer this academy. Students can acquire several industry credentials in the Hospitality and Tourism cluster.

Prologis Trade and Logistics Academy was established in 2019 to prepare our students for Logistics and Supply Chain positions. The course will help students acquire the necessary skills and lay the groundwork for higher learning at the college and universitylevel.
